Classroom Expectations:

- o Show Respect - Show respect for yourself, other people, property, and for every student's right to a quality education.
- o Be Prepared – When the bell rings you should be in your seat with class materials, INB and BDR out, ready to begin working.

Tardy Policy:

Grading Policy:

- o Homework/Classwork 40%
- o Tests/Projects 45%
- o Six Weeks Test 15%

Late Work Policy:

- o I expect all assignments to be turned in the day they are due.
- o Students have three days to turn in an assignment after the due date has passed.
- o The maximum grade you can receive on a late assignment is a 70.
- o After the third day, the assignment will be a zero.

Tutoring/Extra Help:

- o Tutoring will be offered Tuesday after school, from 3:45-4:15. Lunch or morning tutorials may be available if needed and must be discussed with me beforehand.
- o If you are unable to attend tutoring but need additional help, try searching specific topics on KhanAcademy.com. Khan Academy is a great resource that includes how-to videos, practice problems and reviews for the topics we cover in class.

Supplies:

Students will need to bring the following supplies to class every day:

- o INB (interactive notebook) which is either a 3 or 5 subject spiral (preferred) or a composition notebook with at least 100 pages.
- o Pocket folder (unless your INB has one built in)
- o Pencil
- o Pens and/or markers for notes/grading

*** Optional Supplies: If you would like to contribute some additional supplies for student use in the classroom, these frequently need to be replenished and are greatly appreciated:
